Nine Novena Masses for the Dead

Beginning the Vigil of All Saints (Saturday), a Novena of Masses for the Dead will take place as we begin the month of November. They will conclude on Sunday 8th November. (Solemnity of All Saints falls on a Sunday this year). ALL WEEKDAY MASSES OF THE NOVENA – will take place in St. Mary's Church at 7pm. (access available via the webcam).

Annual Masses for the Commemoration of the Dead

Will take place in - St. Mary's Church on Sunday 1st November at 10am. and St. Joseph's Church at 11.30am.

A 'candle ceremony' will take place, during the Mass. This year due to social distancing one person will light each of the candles on the altar, (candles provided) which they can collect in the sacristy after Mass. The names of the deceased in our parish since the ceremony last year will be displayed in each church during the month of November.

Plenary Indulgence

Is applicable for the duration of the month of November, for the faithful who visit a cemetery and pray for the deceased and the Holy Souls. It is extended due to the pandemic.

November Month for the Deceased

November is traditionally the month when we remember and celebrate: 'the lives of those for whom life has changed and the door of death has closed behind them.' In each of our churches in the parish during November there will be a basket placed in the Sanctuary for parishioners to place sealed envelopes of the names of the dead of their loved ones/family circle/relatives/friends. During November we are invited to remember in a special way, our departed loved ones. The donations offered will be forwarded to charity.

Remembrance Reflection

"This year, the month of November, in which we traditionally remember the dead and pray for the bereaved, will be particularly poignant. We sense a huge yearning for consolation and hope in the heart of our people. We are especially mindful in 2020 of those grieving families, who, because of restrictions, have been unable to experience the customary spiritual and community supports which are so much part of our Irish tradition. Today the 1st November at 3pm the bishops and priests of Ireland will lead a short service of prayer to dedicate the month of November to 'Remembrance of the Dead and Prayer for the Bereaved'. We invite the whole country to unite in this moment which will be followed by parish liturgies throughout the month of November, reaching out as much as possible to those who cannot be physically present" This pandemic, unfortunately, has not gone away and will most likely be with us for the foreseeable future. With faith, hope and love, we are called to support one another so that we will emerge stronger and more resilient from this testing time. In difficult

times of the past our ancestors looked to their faith in Christ for light in the darkness, for hope against despair. We do so again, confident that Jesus is the Way, the Truth and the Life, and that God brings comfort to those who are anxious, healing to the sick and eternal rest and peace to the dead. The Service of Intercession can be viewed from St. Eugene's Cathedral at 3pm. A Cross and/or a lit candle might be our focus of prayer and meditation. (www.derrydiocese.org) In this parish our two Sunday morning Masses will be our Annual Commemoration for the deceased of our family circle.
