Parish Envelopes: If anyone wishes to sign up for a box of envelopes, who did not 'sign-up' when we began this process - please place your name/address/tel no in a sealed envelope and place in the collection basket. Coronavirus: Until further notice restrictions of holy water in the fonts of each church are not available. Holy water is still available to bring home from the containers. Eucharistic Ministers will not be offered the chalice, and are not currently bringing communion to the sick at the weekend. We are also to refrain from offering the sign of peace. We are endeavouring to apply good practice as directed in these uncertain times.

Reading: First Reading: The Lord's providence embraces daily needs such as water, bread and milk while also promising an everlasting covenant. **Second Reading:** St. Paul concludes a major section of his letter to the Romans with a wonderful statement of trust in God. Nothing whatever, not even death itself, can come between us and the love of God. **Gospel:** The miracles of the loaves and fish points towards the Eucharist, and the emphasis falls on the loaves. Listen to the verbs that describe the actions of Jesus when he is handed the loaves: he took, he blessed, he broke, he gave. These are the verbs that will describe Jesus' actions at the Last Supper.

Reflection: 'Somebody Loves You' Somebody loves you more than you know, somebody goes with you wherever you go. Somebody really and truly cares, and lovingly listens to all of your prayers ... Don't doubt for a minute that this is true, for God loves his children and takes care of them, too ... And all of his treasures are yours to share, if you love Him completely and show that you care ... And if you walk in his footsteps and have faith to believe, there is nothing you ask for that you will not receive!

Feasts during the Week: Tuesday - St. John Vianney: He contended with poverty, military service in France. Despite his intellectual shortcomings, he is known as the 'Cure du Ars'. He is the patron saint of priests. Wednesday - St. Mary Major: The basilica was built by Pope Sixtus III after the Council of Ephesus (431). It is the first church in the West named in honour of the Mother of God. Thursday - The Transfiguration: The Cross requires the exodus of Jesus, his death, Resurrection and glorification. Saturday - St. Dominic: A Spaniard who founded the Order of Preachers (Dominicans).
