<u>Christmas Eve</u> St. Mary's Church - 4pm (additional Mass) 6pm. St. Joseph's Church - 8pm.

<u>Christmas Morning</u> St. Mary's Church - 9am. - St. Joseph's Church - 11am.

To accommodate increased numbers attending Christmas Masses, we will operate a 'track and trace' system. This means you are required to provide your contact details (name, address, telephone number – number of people to be seated together – 'social bubble' – data sheets attached).

By indicating your intention to attend a Christmas Mass – (Mass will be allocated with respect to numbers permitted in the church), your seat allocation will be offered on a 'first registered – first accommodated' process. (You may only attend one Mass over the Christmas period to permit other members of our parish community to attend a Christmas Mass). Please, be aware just because you or your family has registered your intentions to attend a Christmas Mass, it does not automatically mean that you will be able to attend.

Once we are aware of the numbers, that we can safely permit to gather in the church, we will print a seating arrangement map for each church and for each service. These will be available to view at the back of each church once they are correlated, and no later than Sunday 20th December.

We advise that you arrive at the church, at least 10/15 minutes before the Mass begins. You will be greeted by a steward/usher who will have a seating plan – they will guide you or your family group to your designated seat. Once the seating arrangements are finalized, they will reflect the required regulations pertaining to – (1) Family Bubbles (2) Social Distancing.

I ask for your co-operation in our efforts to manage the safety of all who gather for our Christmas Services. Please ensure that you use the santiser as you enter and leave the church, also wear a facial mask, unless you are exempt from doing so.

All who enter the church will be seated, there will be **NO** standing at the back of the church or around the porch area. Once the Mass has concluded and instructed by the stewards/ushers you will be invited to exit the church safely from the back first.

PS - Data Sheets are provided for signing at the back of each church. (You may indicate your preferred choice of Mass, however there is no guarantee that it will be available).

Season of Advent - Gaudete Sunday: Season of Advent (Year B) Gaudete Week: Our week begins with "Gaudete Sunday." Gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin. It comes from the first word of the Entrance Antiphon on Sunday. The spirit of joy that begins this week comes from the words of Paul, "The Lord is near." This joyful spirit is marked by the third candle of our Advent wreath, the colour of the candle is rose/pink. The second part of Advent begins on December 17th each year - this year, in 2020, it will fall on a Thursday, this will be followed by the Fourth Sunday of Advent. For the last eight days before Christmas, the plan of the readings changes. The first readings are still from the prophesies, but now the gospels are from the infancy narratives of Matthew and Luke. We read the stories of faithful women and men who prepared the way for our salvation. We enter into the story of how Jesus' life began. These stories are filled with hints of what his life will mean for us. Faith and generosity overcome impossibility. Poverty and persecution reveal glory. Advent is marked by a spirit of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, of longing expressed in hope for the unfolding day. It is that hope, however faint at times, and that God, however distant He sometimes seems, which brings to the world the anticipation of a King who will rule with truth and justice and righteousness over His people and in His creation.

Sacraments of Initiation: MyFaith.ie is a parish-based programme of preparation for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. It releases new modules every two weeks or so as the children and their families prepare for the Sacraments. Each module begins with a short lesson - for parents - on the content of that module before the next item, a taught lesson for the children. The programme is highly interactive and learning is reinforced though challenges, quizzes and interactive games which are scored but can be repeated indefinitely. This is offered to parents/guardians as a format of instruction during the pandemic.

**Face Coverings/Numbers at Services:** We request the wearing of face coverings as they are now mandatory upon entering and leaving the church. Some people are exempt from the wearing of face coverings, even in situations which would otherwise be mandatory. Please continue to observe social distancing, to use the hand sanitiser on entering and leaving each of our churches.
