St. Patrick's Breastplate (edited form) - I bind unto myself today, the strong Name of the Trinity, by invocation of the same, the Three in One, and One in Three. Christ be with me, Christ within me, Christ behind me, Christ before me, Christ beside me, Christ to win me, Christ to comfort and restore me. Christ beneath me, Christ above me, Christ in quiet, Christ in danger, Christ in hearts of all that love me, Christ in mouth of friend and stranger. I bind unto myself today, the strong Name of the Trinity, by invocation of the same, the Three in One, and One in Three. Of whom all nature hath creation, eternal Father, Spirit, Word: praise to the Lord of my salvation, salvation is of Christ the Lord. Amen.

St. Patrick – Born in the fifth century in Britain. He was taken captive at the age of 16 and brought to Ireland where he was sold as a slave. He tended herds on Slemish mountain for six years. His captivity has a very positive effect on his spiritual life. He prayed many times each day, his faith growing stronger and his love and reverence for God increasing. He escaped back home at the age of 22. It was obvious to him that God was calling him to return to convert the Irish. He is the patron saint of Ireland.

St. Joseph's Church Glenullin: A letter from the St. Joseph's Renovation Committee is in circulation in the Glenullin area of the parish, it is self-explanatory. As stated, responses will be collected after Easter by authorised members of the community. Thank you in anticipation of a favourable response.

Extension of the Covid-19 Shut-down by the Northern Ireland Executive: The Northern Bishops have discussed the evolving situation. In the light of the Executive's extension of the current restrictions, and on the basis of the continued and unequivocal public health message that people should continue to stay at home, the Northern Bishops have agreed that the celebration of the Eucharist and other liturgies should continue, for the time being, to take place without the physical presence of the faithful. Marriage, funeral, baptismal liturgies may continue (subject to strict safety guidelines and regulations) with arrangements being made for live-streaming, where possible. The next NI Executive review of current lockdown provisions will be taking place on **Thursday 18th March.**

The Northern Bishops have agreed to further assess the situation immediately after that date in the cautious expectation that, from Friday 26th March onwards, and in preparation for Holy Week, the faithful may safely gather once more for the celebration of Mass, with all necessary risk assessments having taken place and with all necessary precautions and mitigations in place.

IMPORTANT NOTICE – It is now mandatory as a directive received from the Department of Health via the Diocesan Office that all Services presently permitted in the church ie (Funerals, Wedding's, and Baptisms) to proceed must be recorded through the medium of 'Track and Trace'. Hence, we now must in advance receive the names and contact telephone numbers of those attending Services in our churches.

Parish Envelopes: The new box of parish collection envelopes will be distributed in coming weeks. They will shortly be received from the printers; they then have to be labelled and area

coded before we invite those who deliver them to collect them for distribution. In recent years as previously stated a lot of work to update the parish data base has provided the information required for the distribution of envelope boxes, hence the computer will provide the list for distribution upon usage. There are a substantial number of boxes in circulation in the parish presently un-used, this is the case even prior to Covid-19. Following discussion with the Parish Finance Committee we encourage consideration for those who use envelopes infrequently to consider the use of a standing order, (through this medium you have full control), of the donation at your disposal. Parish Finance: Thank you to those in recent months who continue to contribute to the parish finances by cheque/parish envelopes. Parishioners have found imaginative ways of returning envelopes via the post box at each Parochial House or by post. We thank you for your donations received to date and acknowledge your generosity during these times. All donations are recorded accordingly. (Cheques can be made payable to Parish of Errigal).

Stations of the Cross: Are an ancient part of our Catholic tradition. They help us to enter more fully into the season of Lent. Dates of Passover and Easter: At the Council of Nicea in 325, the date for Easter was fixed as the Sunday after the full moon after the spring equinox. Sunday 4th April 2021 is the Feast of Easter. Eastern Christians calculate the date of Easter according to the Julian calendar, the calendar in general use before the Gregorian reform of 1582. One of the reforms was the removal of ten days from the calendar and this discrepancy between the Julian and the Gregorian calendars results often in a difference in the date for Easter in East and West as

they follow the two calendars. This happens in 2021 when the date for Easter for Eastern Christians is Sunday 2nd May.

The feast of Passover is a seven-day feast, beginning at sundown on the evening of 27th March (14 Nisan 5781).

They try to stay strong. But they lack so many of life's basics. Proper shelter. Food. Access to clean water, healthcare.

AJAK STORY – Ajak is a widowed mother who is moving heaven and earth to provide for her family, despite the poverty and constant threat of violence that surrounds them in Southern Sudan. And she will never forget Awut, who became her friend and lifted her family up when they had nothing. Even with the two mothers sharing all they have, there is nowhere near enough.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Following enquires regarding the reception of this Sacrament (Confession) provision can be accommodated respecting social distancing and wearing a facial mask, by arrangement either in the space provided in the church or alternatively in the Parochial House.

Sacrament of Initiation Dates 2021: Sacrament of Confirmation – will take place in St. Mary's Church on Saturday 5th June at 11am. (Further details will follow).

First Communion - St. Columba's School Saturday 24th April at 11am. St. Patrick's & St. Joseph's School Saturday 15th May at 11am.

Sacraments of Initiation: MyFaith.ie is a parish-based programme of preparation for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. It releases new modules every two weeks or so as the children and their families prepare for the Sacraments. Each module begins with a short lesson - for parents - on the content of that module before the next item, a taught lesson for the children. The programme is highly interactive, and learning is reinforced through challenges, quizzes and interactive games which are scored but can be repeated indefinitely. This is offered to parents/guardians as a format of instruction during the pandemic.

Face Coverings/Numbers at Services: We request the wearing of face coverings as they are now mandatory upon entering and leaving the church. Some people are exempt from the wearing of face coverings, even in situations which would otherwise be mandatory. Please continue to observe social distancing, to use the hand sanitiser on entering and leaving each of our churches.

Anniversary Masses: Anniversary Masses/Month's Mind Masses either to be booked or to be added to the weekend list, need to be recorded in the Anniversary Book in each sacristy. As is the custom previously established, the requested Masses can take place during the week or at the weekend, when the date is available. It is advisable were possible to book well in advance in the case of anniversaries. **In the case of a booked Anniversary Mass please inquire of the sacristan before the Mass begins that the Mass is offered for the intention you request.**

Derry Diocesan Society (DDS): In each of the parishes of the diocese Mass is offered alternating in each parish (list at the back of each church) for deceased and living members who are registered in the society. The deceased members registered are remembered in the anniversary list for three consecutive weekends each quarter (three months). Registration is £20 and can be given to a sacristan or Fr. Crowley - please ensure name and address of the person to be enrolled, and whether it is for a living or deceased member.
