This weekend we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost it brings to completion the fifty days since Easter Day and hence the end of the seven-week period of the Easter Season. The extinguishing of the Paschal Candle indicates that the Easter Season is over.

'Solemnity of Pentecost' The word Pentecost is Greek, and it means "50th day." Fifty days after Easter Sunday, we celebrate the coming of the Holy Spirit upon the Apostles and their followers, and the beginning of their earthly ministry to make 'disciples of all nations'. Pentecost is also a Jewish holiday (Shavuot), which the Jews use to celebrate the end of Passover. Jews celebrate the gift of the law to Moses at Mt. Sinai on this day. (Acts 2:1-31) But we, as Catholics celebrate the birth of our Church.

'Pentecost Prayer' - We light a candle, and enjoy the flickering light, the fragrance and warmth it creates. But without the spark that ignites, there will be no flame. Without the wax, the source of power, the wick will not burn. Without the flame, there will be no fragrance, no warmth, no light. And so, with us, Lord. You are the catalyst that ignites us, and the fuel that sustains us. You fill us with your fragrance as you enter our lives. You empower us to carry your flame in our hearts, to be the fragrance, warmth, and light of your love, in this dark world.

Season after Pentecost or Ordinary Time after Pentecost: The second portion of Ordinary Time begins after Pentecost (tomorrow Monday – this year beginning Week Eight/Cycle 1) and is much longer than the first. This second period of Ordinary Time lasts from the day after Pentecost through the final day before Advent. Because this portion of Ordinary Time occurs after the celebrations of Jesus's Passion, Resurrection, and Ascension, this segment of Ordinary Time is focused on the Age of the Church. The Age of the Church is the age we live in now, the time that exists between the Age of the Apostles and the second and last coming of Christ for which we are preparing. This period of Ordinary Time is also focused on Christ's reign as

King of Kings; the Feast of Christ the King caps off the Season of Ordinary Time as the final Sunday before Advent begins.

Sacrament of Initiation Dates 2021: *Sacrament of Confirmation* will take place in St. Mary's Church on Saturday 5th June at 11am.

First Communion – St. Mary's Church Saturday 12th June at 10.30am. St. Joseph's Church Saturday 12th June at 12.30pm. (Further details will follow for the celebration of the Sacraments via each school shortly).

Consultation on Method of Consultation in preparation for Synodal Assembly: "As you may have heard via the media, the Irish Bishops have decided to initiate a process in the Irish Church, leading to a Synodal Assembly in perhaps five years. The Bishops' Conference plans the next two years as a period of prayer, listening and discernment, involving a nationwide consultative conversation on this theme. Following this, there will be a three-year preparation for a National Synodal Assembly. Before embarking on the Synodal Pathway consultation, bishops are inviting submissions to reflect on what methods/models to adopt in these coming two years of conversations. Individual and groups are invited to submit ideas as to

- how the national conversation might best be conducted,
- what hard-to-reach groups need to be involved.

WELCOME RETURN TO A CAUTIOUS GATHERING IN OUR CHURCHES:

It is important as has been achieved previously with safety guidelines, and social distancing that as our churches have reopened that as we gather using the sanitiser and we do so cautiously and safely.

The following directives apply as before for the foreseeable future. 1. Wearing of facial coverings unless you are except. 2. Respecting Social Distancing. 3. Use of sanitizer upon entering and leaving the church. 4. Limited Numbers in choir and in the Church. (Empty seat in front and behind the seat that is occupied). 5. Provision of stewards and ushers in and outside the church. 6. Directions offered by the stewards/ushers to leave the church safely. NB – The numbers present at funerals and weddings is determined by a risk assessment of the church, and the 'family bubbles' that can safely gather.

St. Joseph's Church Glenullin (Renovation Committee): We hope everyone in the area recently received a letter regarding contributions to the parish and specifically to the Renovation Fund, and a form for you to indicate your preferred option for donations. In response to this, collectors have called to houses around Glenullin recently to collect these envelopes. We request that you place your name and details in the sealed envelope provided. Presently 112 responses have been received of the 340+ letters in circulation regarding the letter as stated above. As the collection of the envelopes have taken place in recent weeks, we would appreciate any further returns to be made via the church collection box.

Details as provided in the letter circulated, it would seem the title of the account is where the problem arises. Account titles are in red as stated above.

Parish Envelopes: The new box of parish collection envelopes are presently in use. In recent years as previously stated a lot of work to update the parish data base has provided the information required for the distribution of envelope boxes, hence the computer will provide the list for distribution upon usage. There are a substantial number of boxes in circulation in the parish presently un-used, this is the case even prior to Covid-19. Following discussion with the Parish Finance Committee we encourage consideration for those who use envelopes infrequently to consider the use of a standing order, (through this medium you have full control), of the donation at your disposal. To you God entrusted His only Son; In you Mary placed her trust; with you Christ became man Blessed Joseph, to us too, show yourself a father, and guide us in the path of life. Obtain for us Grace, Mercy and Courage, and defend us from every evil. Amen.

He set up his see at canterbury and had much success in converting the south of England.

Sacrament of Reconciliation: Following enquires regarding the reception of this Sacrament (Confession) provision can be accommodated respecting social distancing and wearing a facial mask, by arrangement either in the space proved in the church or alternatively in the Parochial House.

Stamp Boxes: There is a box at the back of each church for the collection of used stamps for the missions.

Sacraments of Initiation: MyFaith.ie is a parish-based programme of preparation for First Holy Communion and Confirmation. It releases new modules every two weeks or so as the children and their families prepare for the Sacraments. Each module begins with a short lesson - for parents - on the content of that module before the next item, a taught lesson for the children. The programme is highly interactive, and learning is reinforced though challenges, quizzes and interactive games which are scored but can be repeated indefinitely. This is offered to parents/guardians as a format of instruction during the pandemic.

Face Coverings/Numbers at Services: We request the wearing of face coverings as they are now mandatory upon entering and leaving the church. Some people are exempt from the wearing of face coverings, even in situations which would otherwise be mandatory.
