'Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful, and kindle in them the fire of your love.' There are three Sacraments of Initiation (Welcome) Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. In our tradition the Sacrament of Confirmation completes the initiation of the person into the church. Our children now receive this Sacrament and attain the status of adult Christians. The Spirit of the Lord is sent upon the candidates, they are anointed on the forehead with the oil of chrism; and are addressed with the words ... 'Be sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit.' This Sacrament sends the children out to live as Christians. They will not look any different. The fully committed Christian is one who sees Christ in every situation and in every person he/she meets. So, we ask you to pray for the children who will be confirmed, asking the Holy Spirit to give them strength to live out in their lives the promises they make on their Confirmation Day.
