Parish Envelopes: If anyone wishes to sign up for a box of envelopes, who did not 'sign-up' when we began this process - please place your name/address/tel no in a sealed envelope and place in the collection basket. Coronavirus: Until further notice restrictions of holy water in the fonts of each church are not available. Holy water is still available to bring home from the containers. Eucharistic Ministers will not be offered the chalice, and are not currently bringing communion to the sick at the weekend. We are also to refrain from offering the sign of peace. We are endeavouring to apply good practice as directed in these uncertain times.

Readings: First Reading: Elijah learns that when the Lord wants to communicate with us, he does so not by shouting but by whispering. Wind, fire and earthquake may draw our attention, but the Lord's voice is gentle. He does not impose himself. **Second Reading:** St. Paul dedicates a good section of his letter to the Romans to grappling with the relationship between Israel, the people of the Covenant, and the new Covenant of Christ. His final answer is not a solution, but a hymn to the wisdom of God. **Gospel:** The Lord walks on water. This miracle is intended to point back to the passage of God's people through the sea as Moses led them out of captivity. Now, it is Jesus who leads us from the captivity of sin, and this happens by our passage through the water of Baptism.

Feasts during the Week: Tuesday - St. Clare: She was born in Assisi in 1193, died 1253. She followed St. Francis in his life of poverty and was founder of the Poor Clares. She led an austere life, abounding in works of piety and charity. **Friday - St. Maximilian Kolbe:** Died in Auschwitz 1941. He was a Franciscan who worked in the apostolate in Poland and Japan. He took the place of another prisoner destined for the gas chamber.
